

DOWNTOWN TORONTO GROWING FASTER THAN PERIPHERY FOR THE FIRST TIME






% change in population




ECHO BOOMERS NOW THE LARGEST GENERATION IN CANADA






ECHOES MAKE UP THE MAJORITY OF THE DOWNTOWN CORE




