Recommendations for governments:

Build a community around applicants and municipal technology solutions rather than a fight for resources.

Ensure that competition goals are clear by co-creating program goals with municipalities to ensure a broader alignment for national and local governments.

Clarify the role of the public to urge municipalities to realize systemic change in furthering smart city adoption.

Support data governance and privacy standards through competitions with multiple rounds so that municipalities can sharpen these areas.
